Columbia Council points with pride to our basketball players and teams who have just completed a successful basketball season.

Lancaster Catholic Crusaders Basketball News:

Brother Lamar Kauffman, head coach of the Crusader Girls Varsity Team, traveled to Shillington at Gov. Mifflin Intermediate School on March 16th. His girls faced a determined Villa Joseph Marie squad (16-12) in a PIAA Class AAA 2nd round contest. The Jems outran the infamous Crusader press and won 53-45.

The loss brought to a close an otherwise outstanding season for Coach Kauffman and his girls. Their record is 25-5. Despite the loss Brother Kauffman had praise for his squad, "I think they were overachievers . . . they achieved more than what they were capable of and that's good."

At the end of this season Kauffman's record with LCHS stands at 679 victories. He has secured his spot in the Lancaster-Lebanon League history books having just ended his 29th season as head coach of the Lady Crusaders. Congratulations "Morrie".

One of our council's newest and youngest brother's, Luke Wolgemuth, is a senior member of the Lancaster Catholic Boys Varsity Basketball Team. The teams' season came to an end when they came up against the defending PIAA Class AAA Champs Neumann-Goretti H.S. The Crusaders lost in the Eastern Final 82-75.

Are you a shift worker or retired? Would you like a way to serve your Council? Consider volunteering for the **Pallbearer Committee** providing a unique service to the Columbia Area for over 40 years.

When a loved one passes away some families are hard pressed to find pallbearers for the funeral. **For the KofC Pallbearer Committee.** We work very closely with the directors at the Clyde Kraft Funeral Home. When we get a call for assistance our members are contacted for their availability.

The committee is always looking to expand its membership. We have lost some members due to health, job changes, death, etc. On average our service is requested about 10 funerals a year. Burying the **dead** is a Corporal Work of Mercy.

What's required? Depending upon the type of service time may vary from one to two hours. This **includes** the interment at the cemetery. So it doesn't require a lot of your time. Out of respect for the **deceased** and family our members are usually attired in a shirt, sport coat or suit.

Group Term Insurance

Many jobs offer some form of group term life insurance. Often, this insurance is an employee benefit provided at no charge, or for small co-pay. Knowing that this coverage exists may convince someone that he doesn't need to discuss personally owned life insurance with a professional agent. That would be a mistake.
