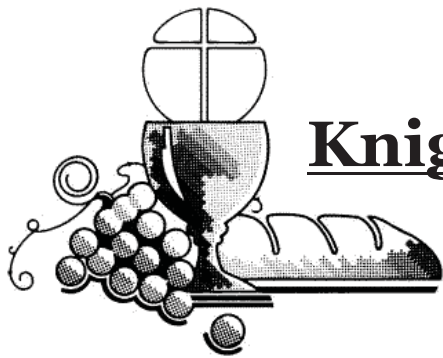

Are you a shift worker or retired? Would you like a way to serve your Council? Consider volunteering for the **Pallbearer Committee**. The Council has been providing a unique service to the Columbia Area for over 40 years.

When a loved one passes away some families are hard pressed to find pallbearers for the funeral. Enter the KofC Pallbearer Committee. We work very closely with the directors at the Clyde Kraft Funeral Home, Inc. When we get a call for assistance our members are contacted for their availability.

The committee is always looking to expand its membership. We have lost some members due to health, job changes, death, etc. On average our service is requested about 10 funerals a year. Burying the dead is a Corporal Work of Mercy.

What's required? Depending upon the type of service time may vary from one to two hours. This includes the internment at the cemetery. So it doesn't require a lot of your time. Out of respect for the deceased and family our members are usually attired in a shirt, tie, sport coat or suit.

Ways to Pay for Whole Life

We live in a world of options and we are constantly bombarded by choices. Some of these make our lives more complicated, but many of these choices are created with the public in mind.

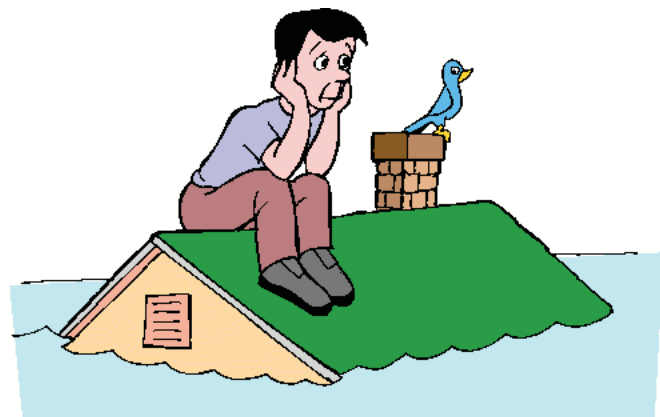

Remind them that on the form to apply of relief it asks the applicant to include documentation such as photo's, news articles, etc. with their submittal.

Again, please contact all councils, members, etc. that may have sustained damage because NOW is the time to act while the opportunity to take photo's still exists to document the loss. This fund has been established and funded by brother knights for brother knights and as such each brother knight that has sustained a loss is entitled to receive help and support from their brother knights.

Please encourage all to take advantage of this fraternal benefit.
